- 3 One rose with own foliage
- 4 One Cluster flowered rose
- 5 Three stems miniature roses, any variety

Section B Flowers Judge Doreen Townley. The Snelling Memorial Cup held by Hazel Dale Evans will be awarded for most points in this section. The Blanch Waskett Trophy held by Liz Russell will be presented to the winner of class 12. A rosette will be Awarded for the best entry in this section.

- 6 Nine stems of sweet peas, 3 stems each colour
- 7 Six stems of Sweet Peas
- 8 Six Pansies
- 9 Six Fuchsia florets
- 10 Six stems of any other flowers of one variety not specified above.
- 11 Three stems of Carnations or Pinks
- 12 One vase or bowl of mixed flowers judged for quality & variety. (Neck of vase max 8" diameter.)
- 13 A foliage plant in a pot
- 14 One flowering plant or plants of one variety in a single pot excluding Cacti or Succulents.
- 15 One Cacti or Succulent.
- 16 A collection of Cacti and/or Succulents in a single container
- 17 A container of three stems of mixed flowering shrubs or trees judged for quality & variety.

- 19 A planted patio container

Section C Fruit Judge Doreen Townley. The GJJM Rose Bowl held by Ron Fallows will be awarded for most points in this section. A Rosette will be presented for the best entry in this section. **PLEASE NOTE THAT ALL FRUIT MUST BE EXHIBITED WITH STALKS AND PRESENTED ON A PLATE.**

Cup also held by Alistair Matthews will be awarded for the best entry in classes 31-45 inclusive. Certificates will be awarded for entries placed 1st, 2nd & 3rd in classes in this section. **Note** All root crops and Lettuce roots must be washed. Onions and Shallots must not be peeled.

The Rettondune Cup currently held by Sheila Wilkinson will be awarded for the best kept garden on the Meadow Road Housing Estate, class 49.

Section G, Cookery Judge Mrs S Dunlevey. The Parish Tray held by Kathryn Evans will be awarded for most points in this section. The Joyce Higgins Memorial Trophy, held by Joy Elliot, will be awarded for the best exhibit in class 58. A Rosette will be presented for the best entry in this section.

- 59 A Cherry Nut Gateau made to this recipe. 4oz margarine, 4oz castor sugar, 2 eggs, 5oz self raising flour, half a level teaspoon baking powder, a few drops almond essence, 3 tablespoons milk. Slice fat and put in a warm bowl with all other ingredients. Beat until smooth. Spread into approx 7" square or 8" round tin and bake for 18 - 20 minutes at 190 C (gas mark 5). Cool on a wire tray and decorate to taste with icing, nuts and cherries.

## Regulations to be observed by all exhibitors

- 1 All produce exhibited must have been grown in the exhibitors own garden or allotment and all plants growing in pots must have been in the actual possession of the exhibitor for at least two months before the day of the show.
- 2 Where an exhibitor wins more than one prize in any class points from only one prize will be counted towards the Cup in that section.
- 3 Entry fees for exhibitors in the Children's Classes 102 to 127 inclusive shall be free. Entry fees for all other classes shall be 20p per entry or 30p per entry if entered on show day.
- 4 Potatoes, peas, beans and fruit must be shown on plates or in boxes supplied by the exhibitor. Fruit of all kinds must be shown with stalks. In all cases exhibitors are reminded that a departure from the numbers specified (more or less) will result in disqualification. Preference will be given, (all other things being equal) to correctly named varieties. For the purposes of exhibition Tomatoes are regarded as a vegetable.
- 5 In collections the number of each variety of vegetable or salad must be as stated in its individual class, e.g., 3 Courgettes, 6 pods of peas.
- 6 The RHS rule book is to be regarded as a general guide.
- 7 In all matters relating to the Horticultural Show decisions of the Society's management committee shall be final.

## Special Entry Conditions

- 1 All entries must be in position for judging by 10-30 am on show day.
- 2 Entries will be accepted in the marquee & hall from 8am on show day.
- 3 No entries will be accepted after 10-30am.
- 4 No person(s) other than the stewards shall be allowed in the marquee or the village hall after judging commences. Produce may not be removed before 4-30pm, only earlier if announced.
- 5 The gift of any produce for sale by auction towards Society funds will be welcome.
- 6 Exhibitors must ensure all their exhibits and entries are as schedule or they may be subject to disqualification by the Judges.
